

# Downtown Spartanburg Prayer-Walk Guide

## Prayer-walking

There is nothing quite like seeing your favorite team in action or your favorite band perform live. It's just different when you are there. But, so often we don't go on-location with our prayers. Prayer-walking is our opportunity to take our desires to see God in action to the very places where we want Him to work. Prayer-walking is a critical part of most short-term mission trips, but it should also be a rhythm of our lives in our own towns.

## Attitude of Prayer-walking

- 1. A pure heart.** In humility, we should come before the Lord with repentance and seek personal holiness before we head out to prayer-walk.
- 2. Worship.** We need to magnify the Lord wherever we are. Prayer-walking is essentially entering into the enemy's territory. We should worship God for His power over the enemy and His ability to change hearts.
- 3. Faith.** We should approach our prayer-walking with eager anticipation of what God will do on the soil and in the hearts of the places you'll go and people you'll see.

## 1. Hope in the Burg Mural - 151 Dunbar Street

- Pray for peace to permeate our streets, homes and hearts.
- Pray for selfless love to run through the veins of our community.
- Pray for deep unity that exists amidst great diversity.
- Pray for every man, woman and child to know and experience the hope found in Jesus.
- Pray for health, healing and recovery for all affected by the painful struggles of life.

## 2. Morgan Square - Across 117 West Main Street

- Pray for the growing number of internationals God is putting in Spartanburg.
- Pray for the refugees who are being resettled here that they would find peace and stability unlike their home countries.
- Pray for those who move here with a different religious background and that they may find Jesus.

## 3. Hub City Art Park -

### Corner of S. Daniel Morgan Ave & W. Henry Street

- Pray for the “homeless mile” that starts a block away on Forest Street.
- Pray for ministries like the Soup Kitchen and Miracle Hill who care for the homeless.
- Pray for more resources for housing, mental healthcare and addiction recovery.

## 4. Spartanburg City Council - 145 West Broad Street

- Pray for racial reconciliation and harmony in our community.
- Pray for the law enforcement officers and first responders.
- Pray for wisdom for our public leaders and elected officials.

## 5. Spartanburg County Public Library - 151 South Church Street

- Pray for the children in our schools as they are exposed to sin every day and a world that wants to influence their gender, sexuality or identity.
- Pray for the children in foster care that they might be reconciled with their family in a healthy environment or placed with a forever home where they will prosper.
- Pray for the salvation of children that they might come to know Jesus at an early age and live their lives making other disciples.

## 6. Denny's Plaza - 203 E. Main Street

- Pray for the collective Church in Spartanburg County that she might be unified and together in striving to share the Gospel.
- Pray for salvation and revival in our city.
- Pray for pastors and ministry workers and for their purity so the enemy would not let them fall to fleshly desires.
